**8 Holi:**  
Known as the "Festival of Colors," this Hindu holiday celebrates the winter harvest and the onset of spring.

**14 Equal Pay Day:**  
Equal Pay Day marks the point when the average woman's current earnings, combined with what she earned in the previous year, equals what the average man was paid last year.

**20-21: Nowruz/Norooz- Persian New Year:**  
Is celebrated by peoples of many different religions and cultures across this vast region. Some of the festival's earliest origins lie in Zoroastrianism, marking one of the holiest days in the ancient Zoroastrian calendar.

**25 International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery:**  
United Nations international observation that offers the opportunity to honor and remember those who suffered and died at the hands of the brutal slavery system. First observed in 2008, the international celebration also aims to raise awareness about the dangers of racism and prejudice.

**8 International Women's Day:**  
This day specifically highlights the political, cultural and economic achievements of women.

**17 St. Patrick's Day:**  
St. Patrick's Day started in Ireland to recognize St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland who brought Christianity to the country in the early days of the faith.

**22 Ramadan Begins:**  
Ramadan — an annual observance for Muslims worldwide — falls in the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. During this time, Muslims abstain from eating or drinking from dawn until dusk.

**31 Transgender Day of Visibility:**  
Bring awareness to transgender people and their identities as well as recognize those who helped fight for the rights of transgender people.
